

**St Kilda Legal Service** is a generalist community legal centre. We now provide **free** legal help to protected people who have a final family violence intervention order and who want to oppose a perpetrator application for a **firearm licence**.

**Section 189 Application** When a final family violence intervention order is imposed the perpetrator of family violence becomes a *prohibited person*.

A person protected by an intervention order can oppose an application by the perpetrator, under section 189 of the *Firearms Act 1996* to have their status changed to non-prohibited and their firearms licence issued or reinstated.

**St Kilda Legal Service** can provide advice, representation and community legal education for this issue throughout Victoria.
